- Commented on the recent Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the City's Reverse Osmosis Water Treatment Facility and invited Peter Kunen, Utilities & Engineering Director, to the podium to announce information on the treatment facility.
- Encouraged the public to participate in the various events for Historic Preservation Month and to learn more about Emancipation Day.
- Announced an upcoming Town Hall at the East 10th Street Community Center on June 13th at 6:00 PM.
- Commented on Memorial Day, noted that the next Commission Meeting will be on Tuesday at 5:30 PM.
- Congratulated Milton Leggett and his staff on Public Works Week.

Commissioner Collins

- Thanked Sheriff William Snyder for his input into our community as well as the members of the public.

Vice Mayor Rich

- Commented on a South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) board meeting that culminated with the Water Treatment Plant ceremony.
- Reported that he attended the Treasure Coast Council of Local Government (TCCLG) meeting and noted a presentation focused on stormwater issues.
- Thanked the SFWMD for attending a reception at the Florida Oceanographic Society (FOS).
- Reported that he attended the Rivers Coalition Meeting and commented on a constitutional amendment to be placed on the ballot for the right to clean and healthy waters. He read the amendment into the record and noted that a link, therighttocleanwater.com, could possibly be added to the City's website; asked for public support.

Commissioner McDonald

- Commented that the opening of the Reverse Osmosis Water Treatment Plant was a monumental event; recognized all who were part of the project.

Mayor Bruner

- Commented on DAR and the anniversary of D-Day. Announced there will be an open house for the 80th anniversary at the Road to Victory Museum.
- Inquired on previous comment on the 7th street traffic/4 way stop.

City Manager Mortell

- Commented that the Florida East Coast Railroad (FECR) is applying for a CRISI Grant and the City will be preparing a letter from the Mayor for the railroad bridge.
- Commented, as noted by Commissioner Rich, a couple of weeks ago, employee Anne Hawkins was awarded the Wendy Lee Parker Award, and the City also received the Environment Education Award for its composting program.
- Read a letter received thanking the Police Department for their ride-along learning experience.
- Reported that the Commission has moved forward with a new program for parking tickets.
- Commented that Eve Samples, Executive Director of the Friends of the Everglades, asked the City to join them to set levels for cyanotoxins in the water. The petition needs to be filed by May 23rd, requested a motion to authorize the Mayor to participate, and it will be on the May 28th City Commission Meeting as a formal item on the agenda.

CLARITY POINTE PUD - SMALL-SCALE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FUTURE LAND USE MAP AMENDMENT LOCATED AT 500 SE INDIAN STREET (LEGISLATIVE) (RC):

ORDINANCE No. 2529-2024; AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FUTURE LAND USE MAP FOR AN APPROXIMATE 9.46-ACRE PARCEL OF LAND FROM MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL TO THE COMMERCIAL FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION; AMENDING THE FUTURE LAND USE MAP; PROVIDING DIRECTIONS TO THE CITY CLERK; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND OTHER PURPOSES.

Jodi Kugler, Development Director, presented, for informational purposes only, the Clarity Pointe Future Land Use Map Amendment.

The applicant, Brad Currie, briefly presented to confirm the consistency with the Comprehensive Plan and request approval when the item is returned to the Commission for Second Reading.

Vice Mayor Rich commented on the Comprehensive Plan and gave statistics on the vacant land in the City. Reports state the City needs more affordable housing and cannot support a change to the land use.

Commissioner Collins agreed with Commissioner Rich and does not support moving forward with changing the land use.

Commissioner Clarke commented on the Comprehensive Plan and the need for discussion pertaining to residential vs. commercial. Stated she spoke with people from the Local Planning Agency (LPA) and reviewed the vote on both the land use and the zoning.

14. CLARITY POINTE PUD - REZONE FROM THE CITY OF STUART OFFICIAL ZONING ATLAS FROM RESIDENTIAL PLANNED DEVELOPMENT (RPUD) TO THE MIXED-USE PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT (MXPUD) ZONING DESIGNATION LOCATED AT 500 SE INDIAN STREET (QJ)(RC):

ORDINANCE No. 2530-2024; AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA, REZONING THE CITY OF STUART OFFICIAL ZONING ATLAS FROM RESIDENTIAL PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT (RPUD) TO THE MIXED-USE PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT (MXPUD) DESIGNATION FOR AN APPROXIMATELY 9.46 ACRE PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF SE INDIAN STREET AND APPROXIMATELY 540 FEET EAST OF KANNER HIGHWAY, TO CONVERT THE EXISTING 84-BED ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY (ALF) WITH MEMORY CARE KNOWN AS CLARITY POINTE TO ALLOW FOR AN INPATIENT PRIMARY MENTAL HEALTH AND RESIDENTIAL DRUG AND ALCOHOL FACILITY WITH MEDICAL DETOX; PROVIDING FOR MASTER SITE PLAN APPROVAL; PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL; PROVIDING FOR SPECIFIED COMMERCIAL USES; PROVIDING FOR SIGNAGE REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING DIRECTIONS TO THE CITY CLERK; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND OTHER PURPOSES.

Mayor Bruner requested ex-parte communications from the Commission. Commissioners disclosed all communications.

Four (4) people sworn; Jodi Kugler, City of Stuart Development Director, Brad Currie, Engineering Design & Construction, Michael Gauger, Retired Deputy Chief of Palm Beach County Sheriff's Department, Jason Ackner, resident.

Jodi Kugler, Development Director, presented Agenda Item #14.

Michael Gauger, retired Chief Deputy of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Department for nearly fifty (50) years, spoke about the need for treatment, a program he started called "Another Way", and his support of this professional organization.

Brad Currie, Engineering Design & Construction, presented on the facility.

Applicant, Jason Ackner, a Martin County resident, gave a presentation with specifics and clarified misinformation that had been disseminated. Provided facility details, insurance, and scholarship information that assists with homeless issues.

Commissioners briefly reviewed and discussed the number of beds, calls, and the facility layout.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

1. Dr. Karen Dodge; Port St. Lucie; A Doctor of this Rehab facility, commented on the statistics of number of beds in facilities and the treatments; in favor of the project.
2. Cynthia Coprash - Stuart; Opposed to the project; concerned about the number of beds and homeless after treatment.
3. James Gordon - Boca Raton; Commented that he is an addict who struggled with opioid addiction and received treatment; in favor of project.
4. Dr. Sofia Georgaoulis - Port St. Lucie; Doctor of substance abuse; advocated for treatment; in favor of project.
5. Louisa Levy - Stuart; Learned a lot from presentations and posed questions to be considered. Feels there is a real need for mental health.
6. Michael Craig - Stuart; Commented on zoning changes; opposed to project.
7. Cynthia Wroble - Stuart; Concerned about the facility being close to her elderly parents.
8. Barbara Pettit - Stuart; Commented at the LPA, lives within 300 feet of the proposed project; expressed concerns; opposed to project.
9. Rich Pettit - Stuart; Stated he lives close to proposed rehab, concerned about the land use change; opposed to the project.
10. Douglas Ashley - Jensen Beach; Commented that with all the numbers presented tonight; it's confusing; encouraged the commission to do their homework.
11. Harriet Shapiro - Stuart; Has office near proposed facility and concerned about her safety; opposed to the project.

Applicant, Jason Ackner, addressed points made by the public.
