- Noted her interest in putting a halt to the ZIP until January 15th, 2025, feels it is causing a lot of issues, and exceptions are being granted one by one.

Commissioner Collins

- Commented that he feels the same discussion takes place at every meeting and that the Board is close to completing the review and should move forward.

Commissioner Clarke

- Requested a set break time/recess for the meeting. Mayor Rich announced a scheduled recess for 11:15 AM for 15 minutes.
- Commented that she would like projects that may allow for exceptions and for the Dec 9th Commission Meeting.

City Manager Mortell stated that he would have staff bring back all potential changes and then have these items go to LPA and CRB Meetings, and then return to the Commission in the last meeting of January or February.

Commissioners continued discussion about having more public hearings.

1. Ronnie Kirchman - Stuart; Spoke on all his employees and how the ZIP is affecting his business.
2. Rod Peterson - Stuart; Commented on vacant lot he was told he could build on it and now he cannot, would like something in writing from the Commission stating he could.
3. Craig Bisset - Stuart; Stated ZIP is creating a hardship as he can not subdivide his property and sell a portion of it.
4. Joe Ciaravino - Palm City; Spoke as President of the Treasure Coast Builders association stating that ZIP is affecting 6000 members in that association and asked the commission to think of that while they are discussing ZIP.
5. Rosi Shepard - Stuart; Stated that ZIP is causing a hardship on her businesses. Also stated a client of hers cannot get a CO on his property due to ZIP and that is now causing her client a hardship.
6. Marc Reiner - West Palm Beach; Commented on his Stuart clients and the issues and financial damages they're experiencing.
7. Barbara Kibby Wagner - Stuart; parking issues in downtown and the reserved spaces in front of the Lyric Theater.
8. Douette Pryce - Stuart; Stated he has invested in the City to help the community, referred to past ZIP, and spoke specifically about R2 and R3 single family home zoning.
9. Albert Brinkley - Time for the Commissioners to conduct themselves in a manner that the public is seeing, Romans 13:1-7. The community is not being heard, but overlooked.
10. Marcela Cambor - Stuart; Stated how frustrating it is to have these meetings in this schedule. Entered a verbal records request - who is part of the mandate.
11. Betty Brinkley - Stuart; Home in jeopardy because others want the area to expand, feels they are disrespected due to the color of their skin.
