2. PRESENTATION OF THE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY ANNUAL REPORT 2024

Pinal Gandhi-Savdas, CRA Executive Director, presented the CRA annual report which includes different CRA projects and programs.

Board Members had a brief discussion of the different programs, the form of advertising these programs, heirs program, and water taxi/tram.

Chair Brechbill commented that he would like to see the CRA make a bigger impact than the \$500 paint-up program and stated that since the Commission is not funding the BDB, that money could be transferred to the CRA to generate more income for the CRA. Would like to revisit a plan and get community input on what they truly want for the City.

Vice Chair Moser stated she would like to see a master-plan for the City and have consultants involved with the community to get their true feedback.

Ms. Gandhi-Savdas stated a yearly plan should occur this year with the Development department.

3. DISCUSSION AND DELIBERATION OF THE CRA FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Ms. Gandhi-Savdas presented the Capital Improvement Plan 2025-2030 and stated that these projects came about from analysis and previous master-plans.

Board Member Scherer commented that these projects are projects the community has

already said they want and asked several questions, such as, is there a parking issue and future plans for City Hall.

Ms. Gandhi-Savdas and City Attorney Lee Baggett responded.

Board Member Scherer continued to speak about the different projects, such as the tree planting program in larger portions, sidewalks, and undergrounding.

Board Member James questioned where the funding is for public-private partnerships for affordable housing in the CRA and asked if this is only city property-owned projects.

Ms. Gandhi-Savdas stated that there is no partnership as of now, a site would need to be identified. She continued and stated this list can contain private properties too, but they currently do not have a private business who are interested in a project.

Chair Brechbill spoke about quiet zones and thinks this is something that he would like to look into. Would like to see Guy Davis finished.

Board Members continued their discussion on the CIP and how to prioritize them.

Vice Chair Moser stated she would like to look at projects that don't have to rely on others to occur. She commented that in the last joint meeting there was not a lot of support for the "Underground refuse system in downtown". She continued to list the projects that she believes should be prioritized.

Board Member James asked if there was a timeframe to prioritize this list and the funding.

Ms. Gandhi-Savdas responded.
