3. PROJECT LIFT LEASE AGREEMENT (RC):

RESOLUTION No. 43-2026; A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF STUART AND PROJECT L.I.F.T., INC. FOR THE OPERATION OF THE FACILITY KNOWN AS "PROJECT LIFT" LOCATED AT 710 SE MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. BOULEVARD, STUART, FLORIDA; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE LEASE AGREEMENT; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Pinal Gandhi-Savdas, Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Director, provided a brief overview of the lease agreement.

Lee Baggett, City Attorney, reviewed the lease terms with the Commission.

Commissioners' discussion with Mr. Bob Zacchio of Project Lift, included property taxes, vocational training, business incubation, sublease options, term of lease, and various guidelines.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

1. James Christie - Port St. Lucie; Thanked CRA and the City for their assistance with homes in East Stuart; questioned what if the community does not agree with the proposed Project Lift Building, opposed to the project.
2. Kodey Johnson - Stuart; Commented on his communications with Project Lift and the Martin County National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). Felt this could build back the community; in favor of the project.
3. Jimmy Smith - Stuart; Thanked the Commission for their support of Project Lift. Kids need education on how to get a job, and it should be in every community; in favor of the project.
4. Gail Goldy - Stuart; Commented in favor of Project Lift but agreed with provisions to the lease to prevent future problems.

4. LETTER OF SUPPORT TREASURE COAST FOOD BANK SENIOR FOOD AND RESOURCE PROGRAM (RC):

RESOLUTION No. 45-2026; A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA, APPROVING LETTER OF SUPPORT TO GOVERNOR DESANTIS FOR 404 SPECIAL CATEGORIES GRANTS AND AIDS OLDER AMERICANS ACT PROGRAM; THE TREASURE COAST FOOD BANK SENIOR FOOD AND RESOURCE PROGRAM. THIS INVESTMENT IS CRITICAL TO REDUCING FOOD INSECURITY AND IMPROVING HEALTH OUTCOMES FOR OLDER ADULTS ACROSS INDIAN RIVER, MARTIN, ST. LUCIE, AND OKEECHOBEE COUNTIES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

6. BACKYARD CHICKENS IN CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICTS (RC):

ORDINANCE No. 2552-2026; AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA AMENDING THE CITY'S LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE CHAPTER II – ZONING DISTRICTS USES ALLOWED,

DENSITY, INTENSITY, SECTION 2.06.00. – SUPPLEMENTAL USE STANDARDS TO ADD A NEW SECTION 2.06.24. BACKYARD CHICKENS IN CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICTS AND TO AMEND THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 8 – ANIMALS, ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL, SECTION 8.2. – LIVESTOCK PROHIBITED IN THE STUART'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, BY REMOVING CERTAIN PROVISIONS RELATED TO ALLOW BACKYARD CHICKENS IN CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICTS; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Jodi Kugler, Development Director, reviewed the rezoning districts for backyard chickens.

Commissioner Clarke commented on land use and adjacent water bodies. She would like language to include a fixed amount of footage from a shoreline. [Ms. Kugler stated the same language can be used as is in Chapter 5, Land Development Code.]

Mayor Reed would like to see an urban center for residential houses and 7-foot-high coops.

Ruth Holmes, Environmental Attorney, noted that she reviewed how sister cities and counties regulate setbacks from the mean high-water line and their decision was to remove allowing for chickens for the Indian River Lagoon and southern water bodies, and she believed adopting the same approach was the right decision for our City.

Commissioner Rich stated there is a lot of concern and does not understand the rush and wants to wait for a full board.

Commissioner Giobbi requested an agreement/permission signed from owners of duplexes.

Commissioner Clarke requested training on how to take care of chicken coops, and to set a limit on applications.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

1. Samantha Smith - Stuart; Commented that the Commission move forward with a decision in favor of backyard chickens.
2. Michelle Ketchum - Stuart; Support up to four (4) backyard hens, healthy eggs, in favor.
3. Amber D'Angelo - Palm City; In support of backyard chickens, people have wanted this for ten (10) years.
4. Bonnie Moser - Stuart; In favor of backyard chickens.
5. Mike Sawtelle - Stuart; In favor, provided several statistics including the number of chickens permitted in other cities.
6. Gwen Hall-Brinkley - Stuart; Requested clarification on the zoning and creeks in a predominantly white neighborhood.
7. Will Laughlin - Stuart; Commented on the benefits of chickens for children, risks have been mitigated with the parcels, fees and incentives, in favor.
