Ali Soule, VP, Community Relations of Brightline, presented Brightline's major milestones, the timeline review for the Treasure Coast, summarized the Phase 2 scope, and reviewed the existing St. Lucie River Bridge rehabilitation and mitigation.

Scott Gammon, Senior Vice President of Construction with Brightline continued with information on St. Lucie River Bridge Potential Replacement and the proposed next steps in funding, design and permitting, and support.

Ms. Soule reported on the safety efforts being made by Brightline. She reported that they have partnered with Martin County School District and look forward to working with the City and Martin County to get the message out to the public.

Commissioners participated in a comment/question and answer period with Brightline. Discussions included safety, education, the intersection at Florida Avenue, and the possibility of a Stuart station, which discussions will begin next year. The Commission thanked Brightline for coming.
